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#### COMMITTEE ON NATURAL RESOURCES

#### ACTIVITY REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY 2012

The Full Committee conducted the following hearings and/or meetings during the month of February 2012:

- Wednesday, February 1, 2012—The Full Committee held a Markup on H.R. 3407, To direct the Secretary of the Interior to establish and implement a competitive oil and gas leasing program for the exploration, development, and production of the oil and gas resources of the Coastal Plain of Alaska, to ensure secure energy supplies for the continental Pacific Coast of the United States, lower prices, and reduce imports, and for other purposes.
- Wednesday, February 1, 2012—The Full Committee held a Markup on H.R. 3408, To set clear rules for the development of United States oil shale resources, to promote shale technology research and development, and for other purposes.
- Wednesday, February 1, 2012—The Full Committee held a Markup on H.R. 3410, To require the Secretary of the Interior to conduct certain offshore oil and gas lease sales, to provide fair and equitable revenue sharing for all coastal States, to formulate future offshore energy development plans in areas with the most potential, to generate revenue for American infrastructure, and for other purposes.
- Wednesday, February 15, 2012—The Full Committee held an Oversight Hearing on "Department of the Interior Spending and the President's Fiscal Year 2013 Budget Proposal."
- **Thursday, February 16, 2012**—The Full Committee held a Markup on H.R. 1837, To address certain water-related concerns on the San Joaquin River, and for other purposes.
- **Thursday, February 16, 2012**—The Full Committee held a Markup on H.R. 4019, To increase employment and educational opportunities in, and improve the economic stability of, counties containing Federal forest land, while also reducing the cost of managing such land, by providing such counties a dependable source of revenue from such land, and for other purposes.

- Wednesday, February 29, 2012—The Full Committee held a Markup on H.R. 491, To modify the boundaries of Cibola National Forest in the State of New Mexico, to transfer certain Bureau of Land Management land for inclusion in the national forest, and for other purposes.
- Wednesday, February 29, 2012—The Full Committee held a Markup on H.R. 1038, To authorize the conveyance of two small parcels of land within the boundaries of the Coconino National Forest containing private improvements that were developed based upon the reliance of the landowners in an erroneous survey conducted in May 1960.
- Wednesday, February 29, 2012—The Full Committee held a Markup on H.R. 1335, To revise the boundaries of the Gettysburg National Military Park to include the Gettysburg Train Station, and for other purposes.
- Wednesday, February 29, 2012—The Full Committee held a Markup on H.R. 2050, To authorize the continued use of certain water diversions located on National Forest System land in the Frank Church-River of No Return Wilderness and the Selway-Bitterroot Wilderness in the State of Idaho, and for other purposes.
- Wednesday, February 29, 2012—The Full Committee held a Markup on H.R. 2157, To facilitate a land exchange involving certain National Forest System lands in the Inyo National Forest, and for other purposes.
- Wednesday, February 29, 2012—The Full Committee held a Markup on H.R. 2240, To authorize the exchange of land or interest in land between Lowell National Historical Park and the city of Lowell in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, and for other purposes.
- Wednesday, February 29, 2012—The Full Committee held a Markup on H.R. 2512, To provide for the conveyance of certain Federal land in Clark County, Nevada, for the environmental remediation and reclamation of the Three Kids Mine Project Site, and for other purposes.
- Wednesday, February 29, 2012—The Full Committee held a Markup on H.R. 2745, To amend the Mesquite Lands Act of 1986 to facilitate implementation of a multispecies habitat conservation plan for the Virgin River in Clark County, Nevada.
- Wednesday, February 29, 2012—The Full Committee held a Markup on H.R. 2947, To provide for the release of the reversionary interest held by the United States in certain 1 and conveyed by the United States in 1950 for the establishment of an airport in Cook County, Minnesota.
