# Committee on Energy and Commerce Full Committee

# May 2011

The full Committee on Energy and Commerce held a markup on Tuesday, May 10, 2011, and Wednesday, May 11, 2011, on the following legislation:

- H.R. 5, the Help Efficient, Accessible, Low-cost, Timely Healthcare (HEALTH) Act of 2011, as introduced. The Full Committee ordered H.R. 5 reported to the House, as amended, by a record vote of \_\_ yeas and \_\_ nays. Mr. Dingell offered Amendment #8 which was agreed to by a voice vote. Amendments offered by the following Members were not agreed to by record votes: Rep. Baldwin (20 yeas and 29 nays); Rep. Barrow (20 yeas and 30 nays); Rep. Waxman (three amendments: 17 yeas and 29 nays, 18 yeas and 29 nays, and 18 yeas and 30 nays); Rep. Pallone (2 amendments: 16 yeas and 30 nays, and 15 yeas and 27 nays); Rep. Towns (18 yeas and 31 nays); Rep. Markey (18 yeas and 31 nays). Amendments presented by Rep. Eshoo, Rep. Schakowsky, and Rep. Dingell were not agreed to by voice vote. Rep. DeGette offered an amendment which was withdrawn.
- H.R. 908, the Full Implementation of the Chemical Facility Anti-Terrorism Standards (CFATS) Act, as reported by the Subcommittee on Environment and the Economy. The markup of H.R. 908 was postponed to May 25 and May 26, 2011.

The full Committee on Energy and Commerce held a markup on Wednesday, May 25, 2011, and on Thursday, May 26, 2011, on the following legislation:

- H.R. 908, the Full Implementation of the Chemical Facility Anti-Terrorism Standards (CFATS) Act, as reported by the Subcommittee on Environment and the Economy. The full Committee ordered H.R. 908 reported to the House, as amended, by a record vote of 33 yeas and 16 nays. Rep. Shimkus offered two amendments, one of which was agreed to by voice vote and one of which was agreed to by a record vote of 27 yeas and 21 nays. Amendments presented by the following Members were not agreed to by record votes: Rep. Waxman (2 amendments: 18 yeas and 26 nays, and 21 yeas and 27 nays); Rep. Markey (16 yeas and 30 nays); Rep. Green (21 yeas and 27 nays); and, Rep. Capps (21 yeas and 27 nays).
- H.R. 1939, Enhancing CPSC Authority and Discretion Act of 2011 a verbatim version of the legislation reported by voice vote by the Subcommittee on Commerce, Manufacturing, and Trade. H.R. 1939 was not brought up for consideration.
