Floor Consideration

The Committee worked on the following bills that were on the House Floor in March:

- March 8, 2022—H.Con.Res.70, Condemning threats of violence against Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs) and reaffirming support for HBCUs and their students, passed the House by a vote of 418 Yeas and 0 Nays under suspension of the rules.
- March 9, 2022—H.R. 2471, the *Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2022*, On motion to agree in Senate amendment with amendment (divisions B, C, F, X, Z, titles 2 and 3 of division N) passed the House by a vote of 361 Yeas and 69 Nays, and On motion to agree in Senate amendment with amendment (remaining divisions) passed the House by a vote of 260 Yeas, 171 Nays, and 1 Present.
- March 30, 2022—H.R. 2954, the *Securing a Strong Retirement (SECURE) Act*, passed the House by a vote of 414 Yeas and 5 Nays under suspension of the rules.
- March 31, 2022—H.R. 6833, the *Affordable Insulin Now Act*, passed the House by a vote of 232 Yeas and 193 Nays.
