## Ninety-Day Plan

As of the date of this interim report, while subject to change, the Select Committee expects the agenda for the next ninety days to include but not be limited to the following hearing:

A January 20 hearing titled, "Making Congress Work Better for the American People: A Recommendation Status Report." This hearing will allow Select Committee members to review the status of previously passed recommendations and hear from the executive officers tasked with implementation of those recommendations. The hearing will feature testimonies from the Architect of the Capitol (AOC), the House Chief Administrative Officer (CAO), and the Clerk of the House of Representatives.

A member briefing on the *AEI Continuity of Government Commission* report. The Commission is wrapping up its report and Commission members will brief the Select Committee on their findings and recommendations. This briefing may or may not be followed by a public hearing.

The Select Committee is also in the process of finalizing dates for several hearings regarding topics to be discussed during Q1 of 2022.

# **Transcripts of Committee Proceedings – Q4**

On October 21, 2021, the Select Committee held a hearing titled, "Modernizing the Congressional Support Agencies to Meet the Needs of an Evolving Congress." The hearing featured two panels. The first panel consisted of the heads of the three Congressional support agencies: the Congressional Research Service (CRS), the Government Accountability Office (GAO), and the Congressional Budget Office (CBO). The second panel was comprised of three veteran analysts from across the public policy sphere. The hearing focused on how Congressional support agencies assist Congress in addressing policy challenges and how to ensure the success of these agencies as they support members and committees. On October 27, 2021, the Select Committee held a hearing titled, "Strengthening the Lawmaking Process: How Data Can Inform and Improve Policy." The hearing featured experts in the field of data analytics, who discussed how collection of data across agencies could benefit from standardization and how that data could be strengthened through improved interfaces and visualizations. On November 4, 2021, the Select Committee held a hearing titled, "Article One: Strengthening Congressional Oversight Capacity." The hearing featured expert witnesses from the Levin Center at Wayne State University Law School, Georgetown University Law Center, and Protect Democracy. The hearing focused on both the immense benefits and challenges associated with increased with effective congressional oversight as well as possible enforcement tools Congress could adopt to address those challenges. On December 8, 2021, the Select Committee held a business meeting to vote on, and approve, the second package of Select Committee recommendations for the 117<sup>th</sup> Congress. In addition to these hearings and business meetings, the Select Committee hosted several "brown bags" for Congressional staff. These three informal discussions included both internal and external guests, including the Government Accountability Office, House Recording Studio, tech entrepreneurs, and others. The Select Committee also held virtual listening sessions with Congressional staff to receive their input on what policies could improve the work that they do. The Select Committee hosted two listening sessions during Q4 with both district staff and Washington, D.C.- based staff.
