

JUNE 2011 FULL COMMITTEE HEARINGS & MARK-UPS

Hearings

June 1, 2011: *“Access to Capital: Can Small Businesses Access the Credit Necessary to Grow and Create Jobs?”* The hearing provided a forum for lenders and business owners to discuss the current economic environment and how they are working together to support private sector job growth. Witnesses from the lending side discussed the demand for capital and current initiatives to encourage small business lending. Small business owners testified about the current economic environment and the capital required to hire new workers.

June 15, 2011: *“Lifting the Weight of Regulations: Growing Jobs by Reducing Regulatory Burdens”* This hearing examined H.R. 527, the Regulatory Flexibility Improvements Act of 2011, and H.R. 585, the Small Business Size Standard Flexibility Act of 2011. The two bills are designed to remove loopholes in the Regulatory Flexibility Act (RFA), as amended by the Small Business Regulatory Enforcement Fairness Act (SBREFA), and strengthen the power of the Office of the Chief Counsel for Advocacy.

June 22, 2011: *“The State of Small Business Access to Capital and Credit: The View from Secretary Geithner.”* The purpose of the hearing was to review the current state of small business access to equity, capital, and debt financing. The hearing focused on the Department of Treasury’s current and future efforts to assist the private sector in providing the needed funds for small businesses to expand and grow.

Markups

June 23, 2011: *“Semiannual Report on the Activity of the Committee on Small Business”* The semiannual report details the Committee’s review and study of legislation within its jurisdiction and the oversight activities undertaken by the Committee. Clause 1(d) of rule XI of the Rules of the House of Representatives for the 112th Congress requires that each standing committee, not later than the 30th day after June 1, submit to the House a semiannual report on the activities of that committee, including separate sections summarizing the legislative and oversight activities of that committee. The markup fulfilled the Committee’s obligation under House Rules.

JUNE 2011 SUBCOMMITTEE HEARINGS

Subcommittee on Healthcare and Technology

June 2, 2011: *“Not What the Doctor Ordered: Health IT Barriers for Small Medical Practices”* The hearing examined the adoption of health information technology by small medical practices. The Subcommittee considered witness testimony regarding the barriers that small providers have encountered and possible solutions for addressing those barriers.

Subcommittee on Oversight, Investigations and Regulations

June 14, 2011: “*Do Not Enter: How Proposed Hours of Service Trucking Rules are a Dead End for Small Businesses.*” The purpose of the hearing was to explore the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration’s proposed rule on Hours of Service and discuss how this regulation would harm small businesses by reducing allowed duty times for motor carriers, hindering the ability for owner-operators and other small businesses to deliver goods nationwide.

Subcommittee on Economic Growth, Capital Access and Tax

June 16, 2011: “*The Dodd-Frank Act: Impact on Small Business Lending.*” The hearing examined the regulatory structure of financial institutions, including the new provisions of the Dodd-Frank Act. The hearing also examined the regulations being proposed to implement the Act that have the greatest impact on small financial institutions and on small business lending. Along with Dodd-Frank, many financial institutions are facing increasing pressure from federal regulators concerned about additional bank failures. This increased pressure has the potential to hamper small business lending since some regulators are taking a disproportionately stringent view of small business lending and loan performance. Witnesses discussed the direct impact of the new law and offered solutions to minimize burdens.

Subcommittee on Contracting and Workforce

June 23, 2011: “*Insourcing Gone Awry: Outsourcing Small Business Jobs.*” The hearing reviewed the implementation of the Administration’s insourcing policies, and the effect of these policies on small businesses. Specifically, the Subcommittee investigated the lack of transparency into the insourcing process, and issues with the cost comparisons used when insourcing is intended to achieve savings. The Subcommittee also addressed the issue of standing in these cases, the decision not to use public-private competitions, and the role the SBA is playing in insourcing decisions.
