- June 2, 2021—Letter to the Honorable Sandra Bruce, Deputy Inspector General Delegated the Duties of Inspector General for the U.S. Department of Education, requesting the Office of Inspector General follow up its 2018 audit of the Department's implementation of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).

Specifically, the requested report shall examine what is known about the racial composition of faculty at IHEs and to what extent the U.S. Department of Education and the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission have taken steps to promote faculty diversity and prevent racial discrimination in faculty hiring, promotion, and compensation.
- June 30, 2021—Letter to the Honorable Joseph Biden, President of the United States, regarding an extension on the pause on federally-held student loan payments, interest, and collections through early 2022. This was a joint letter with Senate Health, Education, Labor and Pensions Chair Patty Murray.
