ACTIVITIES OF THE COMMITTEE ON SMALL BUSINESS 112TH CONGRESS, 2nd SESSION

MARCH 2012 COMMITTEE HEARINGS

March 21, 2012: "A Job Creation Roadmap: How America's Entrepreneurs Can Lead our Economic Recovery." Entrepreneurs are economic leaders -- the innovators who take ideas and turn them into companies that drive the economy. Fast-growing young companies generate the greatest share of new jobs. This hearing examined the current research on entrepreneurship and provided the opportunity for Members to hear directly from successful entrepreneurs about how they started their companies and the challenges they faced. The hearing also addressed creative financing for startups, and the important role of startups in job creation and economic growth.

March 28, 2012: "Large and Small Businesses: How Partnerships Can Promote Job Growth." Increasingly, large and small businesses are partnering to access the research, innovations and services they need to be successful. Large firms are joining with small firms to benefit from their leanness, nimbleness, and creativity. Small companies can also benefit by tapping into the larger distribution networks, financing opportunities, and mentoring programs that large businesses can supply. This hearing examined those alliances, and how they can promote job creation.

MARCH 2012 SUBCOMMITTEE HEARINGS

Subcommittee on Investigations, Oversight and Regulations

March 8, 2012: "Powering Down: Are Government Regulations Impeding Small Energy Producers and Harming Energy Security?" In recent years, a number of small energy producers

and their trade associations have identified new regulatory barriers and hurdles to oil and gas development on federal lands. These new requirements have not only limited their access to important resources, but have also increased the cost and uncertainty in developing oil and gas on federal lands. The results of these policies have been the creation of fewer new jobs by small producers and a reduction in our nation's energy security. The hearing focused on these concerns, particularly United States Department of Interior Bureau of Land Management (BLM) oil and gas leasing policies. In addition, the hearing examined United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) regulations pertaining to oil and gas development on federal lands.

Subcommittee on Investigations, Oversight and Regulations

March 16, 2012: "The Health Care Reform Law: Its Present and Future Impact on Small Businesses and Job Creation." This field hearing held in Colorado examined the implementation of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (PPACA) and its impact on small businesses. In particular, the Subcommittee considered the employer mandate and how that provision will affect small business job creation. The Subcommittee also discussed the confusion and uncertainty the PPACA is causing small businesses as the law is implemented.
