- (1) The Subcommittee on Communications and Technology held a hearing on Thursday, February 7, 2019, entitled, "Preserving an Open Internet for Consumers, Small Businesses, and Free Speech."
- (2) The Subcommittee on Communications and Technology held a hearing on Wednesday, February 13, 2019, entitled, "Protecting Consumers and Competition: An Examination of the T-Mobile and Sprint Merger."

- (1) The Subcommittee on Oversight and Investigations held a hearing on Tuesday, February 26, 2019, entitled, "EPA's Enforcement Program: Taking the Environmental Cop Off the Beat."
- (2) The Subcommittee on Oversight and Investigations held a hearing on Wednesday, February 27, 2019, entitled, "The Public Health Threat and Federal Response to Ongoing Measles Outbreaks."

### **LETTERS**

### Chairman Frank Pallone, Jr. with Subcommittee Chairs and other House and Senate Leaders

- **Feb. 1, 2019** Chairman Pallone, co-signed by Subcommittee chairs Diana DeGette and Paul Tonko, sent a letter to Acting Administrator of the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Andrew Wheeler, reiterating their request for information on a series of actions taken by the Administration relating to the EPA Office of Enforcement and Compliance Assurance (OECA). EPA has failed to provide information requested in an earlier letter dated December 6, 2018.
- **Feb. 4, 2019** Chairman Pallone and Subcommittee Chairman Tonko sent a letter to Federal Communications Commission (FCC) Chairman Ajit Pai requesting information and documents related to the FCC's current workload, the work of its bureaus and offices, and its interactions with the public through its handling of consumer complaints and FOIA requests.
- **Feb. 5, 2019** Chairman Pallone and Subcommittee Chairwoman Schakowsky sent a letter to Tim Cook, Chief Executive Officer of Apple, Inc., requesting additional information regarding security flaws in its Group Face Time feature, believed to have compromised consumer privacy, and other unresolved programing bugs.
- Feb. 6, 2019 Chairman Pallone and Senator Ron Wyden, Ranking Member, Senate Committee on Finance, sent a letter to Comptroller General of the Government Accountability Office (GAO) Gene L. Dodaro, seeking a determination on whether the Trump Administration's 2018 guidance on Section 1332 waivers is subject to the Congressional Review Act (CRA). Under Section 1332 of the Affordable Care Act (ACA), states receive the authority to waive certain requirements of the law in favor of new reforms if the states maintain the level of benefits, affordability, and coverage provided by the ACA.
- Feb. 7, 2019 Chairman Pallone joined with other House Chairmen Elijah E. Cummings (Oversight and Reform), Jerrold Nadler (the Judiciary), and Adam Schiff (Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence) in co-signing a letter to Acting Department of Justice Attorney General Matthew G. Whitaker requesting explanation of the extent of his involvement with World Patent Marketing, and his failure to return thousands of dollars back to victims of the company's alleged scam, which is under scrutiny by the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) for "deceiving customers and suppressing complaints about the company by using threats of criminal prosecution against dissatisfied customers."
- **Feb. 8, 2019** Chairman Pallone and Subcommittee Chairs Anna Eshoo and Diana DeGette sent a letter to the Administrator of the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) expressing concern regarding the findings in a recent GAO report "CMS Action Needed to Ensure Compliance with Abortion Coverage Requirements" (GAO-19-159) and requesting certain specified records and written answers to a series of questions contained in the letter.

- **Feb. 8, 2019** Chairman Pallone and Subcommittee Chairs DeGette and Tonko sent a letter to EPA Acting Administrator Andrew Wheeler requesting information on EPA's controversial decisions to rollback three separate climate change rules: The Clean Power Plan; fuel economy standards for vehicles; and the methane rule.
- Feb. 13, 2019 Chairman Pallone, full Committee Ranking Member Greg Walden, Subcommittee on Health Chair Eshoo, Subcommittee Ranking Member (Health) Michael Burgess, Subcommittee on Oversight and Investigations Chair DeGette, and Subcommittee Ranking Member (Oversight and Investigations) Brett Guthrie cosigned a letter to the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) Commissioner Scott Gottlieb regarding the Committee's examination of the FDA ability to ensure the safety of the nation's drug supply. In particular, the letter requests a briefing on a series of recalls that appear to involve drugs manufactured abroad that may have been contaminated with trace amounts of known carcinogens.
- Feb. 15, 2019 Chairman Pallone and seven other standing committee chairs sent a joint letter to Office of Management and Budget (OMB) Director Mick Mulvaney requesting he direct federal agencies to reschedule all canceled public hearings and meetings, reopen comment periods that closed during the government shutdown, and extend comment periods that were open during the shutdown.
- **Feb. 19, 2019** Chairman Pallone and Subcommittee on Consumer Protection and Commerce Chairwoman Jan Schakowsky sent a letter to Facebook, Inc. Chairman and CEO Mark Zuckerberg regarding the private or anonymous nature of closed Facebook groups, in particular that there was exposure of unauthorized disclosure of personal health information, harassment, and a risk of discrimination. The letter also included a request for a staff briefing on the issues raised in the letter as part of the committee's investigations.
- Feb. 19, 2019 Chairman Pallone joined Chairman Robert "Bobby" Scott (House Education and Labor Committee) and Senate leaders Patty Murray (Senate Ranking Member on HELP Committee) and Ron Wyden (Senate Ranking Member on Finance Committee) on a letter to Administrator Seema Verma with the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services, regarding serious concerns regarding policies included in the proposed rule, published on Jan. 24, 2019, "Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act; HHS Notice of Benefits and Payment Parameters for 2020." Concerns included were potential for Americans to lose coverage, increased premiums, greater out-of-pocket expenses, and tighter restrictions on coverage for women's reproductive health services.
- **Feb. 19, 2019** Chairman Pallone and Senator Ron Wyden sent letter to Secretary of Health and Human Services (HHS) Alex M. Azar on concerns about HHS ongoing promotion and approval of harmful Medicaid waivers that undermine access to healthcare and violate the plain text and purpose of Title XIX of the Social Security Act and Congress's longstanding intent for the Medicaid program.
- **Feb. 21, 2019** Rep. Frank Pallone, Jr. joined Senators Sheldon Whitehouse and Thomas R. Carper on a letter to Acting Inspector General of the EPA, Charles J. Sheehan, requesting an investigation into potential violations of the Ethics in Government Act by certain individuals with the EPA Office of Air and Radiation.
- Feb. 22, 2019 Chairman Pallone and Subcommittee Chairwoman Schakowsky sent a letter to Acting Chairman Ann Marie Buerkle of the Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) announcing the committee's intent to commence oversight of the commission and requested CPSC to provide updates on the commission's workload, operations of its offices, and interactions with the public through its handling of consumer complaints and FOIA requests.

**Feb. 25, 2019** – Chairman Pallone wrote to HHS Secretary Alex M. Azar to request more information about the Administration's recently announced initiative to end the HIV epidemic in America. The letter includes a series of questions and a request that the committee staff be briefed by HHS staff regarding this request.

Feb. 28, 2019 – Chairman Pallone and four other Committee chairs: Adam Smith from Armed Services; Raul M. Grijalva from Natural Resources; and Eddie Bernice Johnson from Science, Space, and Technology, signed a letter to the President expressing concerns and raising questions about recent reports that the National Security Council proposed plans to assemble a secret panel to counter the scientific consensus on climate change and question its impacts on the national security of the United States.

**Feb. 28, 2019** – Chairman Pallone and Subcommittee chairs Eshoo and DeGette sent letter to HHS Secretary Alex M. Azar expressing dismay that HHS has published a rule revising the regulations for the Title X family planning program that undermines the integrity of this critical program and the health of the patients it serves. The letter includes a request for answers to a series of questions raised by this rule revision.
