ACTIVITIES OF THE COMMITTEE ON SMALL BUSINESS 112TH CONGRESS, 2nd SESSION

APRIL 2012 COMMITTEE HEARINGS

April 18, 2012: "The Tax Outlook for Small Businesses: What's on the Horizon?" Tax season reminds us that small businesses are disproportionately affected by tax compliance. For small business owners, tax rates can drive business decisions. Higher tax rates can mean that small firms have less capital to create jobs and invest back in their companies. Small companies can also be adversely affected by tax paperwork and recordkeeping requirements. This hearing provided Members with an opportunity to learn more about the tax policies that small businesses will face.

APRIL 2012 SUBCOMMITTEE HEARINGS

Subcommittee on Agriculture Energy and Trade

April 2, 2012: "Impact of U.S. Trade Policies on Small Businesses and Manufacturing." According to Census data, the United States exported over \$2.1 trillion in 2011, or 14 percent of the gross domestic product (GDP). Small businesses play a large role in exports, as they account for nearly 98 percent of all identified exporters. This field hearing, which took place in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, examined the impact of international trade policies on small manufacturers, while also identifying best practices to promote domestic exports.

April 25, 2012: "Small Business Innovators: On the Cutting Edge of Energy Solutions." The purpose of the hearing was to examine innovative ways small businesses contribute to energy production. Specifically, the Subcommittee focused on advanced biofuels, such as cellulosic ethanol, and new innovative technologies small companies have developed to produce energy from previously unused materials. The Subcommittee also looked at the role of research and development in spurring innovative technology within the advanced biofuels field.

Subcommittee on Economic Growth, Tax and Capital Access

April 19, 2012: "Equity Finance: Catalyst for Small Business Growth." Equity financing is a funding method where a business owner sells a percentage of their company in exchange for an ownership stake. Because many start-up businesses do not have sufficient assets to pledge as collateral to secure a bank loan, equity finance is an important source of funding. Equity finance provides not only growth capital, but also strategic partners who are invested in the business's success. Witnesses discussed the affect of the current regulatory environment on equity finance and ways to strengthen the entrepreneurial funding ecosystem.

Subcommittee on Healthcare and Technology Joint Hearing with Committee on Science, Space and Technology Subcommittee on Investigations & Oversight

April 25, 2012: "How the Report on Carcinogens Uses Science to Meet its Statutory Obligations, and its Impact on Small Business Jobs." The Report on Carcinogens (RoC) is a Congressionally mandated, science-based, public health report that identifies substances that may cause cancer and pose a risk to people in the United States. The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' (HHS) National Toxicology Program (NTP), an interagency program administered by the National Institute of Environmental Health Sciences, produces the Report on Carcinogens. The NTP published the 12th RoC last year and is embarking on preparations for the 13th RoC. Witnesses discussed the history of the RoC, the process and science that NTP uses to meet its statutory obligations, and the RoC's impact on small businesses.
