There were no meetings held by the full Committee in March of 2019.

SUBCOMMITTEE ON COMMUNICATIONS AND TECHNOLOGY Mike Doyle, Subcommittee Chairman

Hearings

The Subcommittee on Communications and Technology held a legislative hearing on Tuesday, March 12, 2019, entitled, "Legislating to Safeguard the Fee and Open Internet." This hearing focused on the bill H.R. 1644, the "Save the Internet Act of 2019", introduced by Rep. Mike Doyle (D-PA).

Markups

The Subcommittee on Communications and Technology held a markup on Tuesday, March 26, 2019, on H.R. 1644, the "Save the Internet Act of 2019". A summary of the markup is as follows:

H.R. 1644, the "Save the Internet Act of 2019" was introduced by Rep. Mike Doyle (D-PA). The bill would repeal the Federal Communication Commission's (FCC) Restoring Internet Freedom Order, restoring as of January 19, 2017, the FCC's 2015 Net Neutrality Order, 47 Code of Federal Regulations Part 8, and any other rule that the Restoring Internet Freedom Order modified or repealed. This bill would codify the FCC's 2015 Open Internet Order. Following legislative hearings on March 12, 2019, the Subcommittee met in open markup session on March 26, 2019, to consider H.R. 1644. Subsequently, a motion by Mr. Doyle to favorably forward H.R. 1644 to the full Committee, without amendment, was agreed to by a record vote of 18 yeas to 11 nays.

Kelly (D-IL); H.R. 1506, the "Fair and Immediate Release (FAIR) of Generic Drugs Act" (Rep. Barragán (D-CA); H.R. 1520, the "Purple Book Continuity Act of 2019" (Rep. Eshoo (D-CA).

(4) **H.R.1503**, the "Orange Book Transparency Act of 2019" (Kelly of IL), was favorably forwarded to the full Committee, amended, by a voice vote.

An amendment (Manager's amendment) by Ms. Kelly of IL., # 1, was agreed to by a voice vote.

(5) **H.R. 1499**, the "Protecting Consumer Access to Generic Drugs Act of 2019" (Rush), was favorably forwarded to the full Committee, amended, by a voice vote.

The following amendments were offered:

- (1) An amendment (Manager's amendment) by Mr. Rush, # 1, was agreed to by a voice vote.
- (2) An amendment by Mr. Upton, # 2, was defeated by a roll call vote: 11 18.
- (6) **H.R. 965**, the "Creating and Restoring Equal Access to Equivalent Samples Act of 2019" (Cicilline), was favorably forwarded to the full Committee, amended, by a voice vote.
 - The following amendments were offered:
 - (1) An amendment by Mr. Gianforte, # 1, was defeated by a voice vote.
 - (2) An amendment by Mr. Welch, #2, was agreed to by a voice vote.
 - (3) An amendment by Mr. Buchson, #3, was defeated by a voice vote.

(9) **H.R. 1425**, the "State Health Care Premium Reduction Act" (Craig), was favorably forwarded to the full Committee, amended, by a roll call vote: 18 - 13.

- (1) An amendment in the nature of a substitute by Mr. Pallone, # 1, was agreed to by a roll call vote: 18-12.
- (2) An amendment by Mr. Burgess, # 1a, was defeated by a roll call vote: 12-17.

(10) **H.R.987**, the "Marketing and Outreach Restoration to Empower Health Education Act of 2019" (Blunt Rochester), was favorably forwarded to the full Committee, without amendment, by a voice vote.

The following amendments were offered:

- (1) An amendment by Mr. Shimkus, #1, was defeated by a voice vote.
- (2) An amendment by Mr. Carter of GA, # 2, was defeated by a voice vote.
- (11) **H.R. 986**, the "Protecting Americans with Preexisting Conditions Act of 2019" (Kuster), was favorably forwarded to the full Committee, without amendment, by a roll call vote: 19 –13. No amendments were offered.
- (12) **H.R. 1010**, a bill to provide that the rule entitled "Short-Term, Limited Duration Insurance" shall have no force or effect (Castor of FL.), was favorably forwarded to the full Committee, without amendment, by a roll call vote: 19 13.

LETTERS

Chairman Frank Pallone, Jr. with Subcommittee Chairs and other House and Senate Leaders

Mar. 7, 2019 – Chairman Pallone, co-signed a bipartisan letter with the following Committee members – Reps. Eshoo, DeGette, Ruiz, Walden, Burgess, Guthrie, and Mullin – to Rear Admiral Michael D. Weahkee, Acting Director of the Indian Health Service (IHS) of the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), expressing concern over a news report detailing numerous medical failures persisting at the Pine Ridge IHS hospital and Rosebud IHS hospital in South Dakota, despite repeated warnings from federal watchdogs. The letter requested the IHS provide a briefing to Committee staff on these accounts, as well as a request for IHS to provide details as to what Congress could provide to improve the operations of the Indian Health Service.

Mar. 7, 2019 – Chairman Pallone and Subcommittee Chairman Doyle sent a letter to Federal Communications Commission (FCC) Chairman Ajit Pai requesting information and documents related to the FCC's policies with respect to the retention and disposition of electronic communications, including email, text messages, and other social media messages, as well as information regarding the agency's implementation of any official document under the National Archives and Record Administration 2012 Directive under the Federal Records Act.

Mar. 13, 2019 – Chairman Pallone with Subcommittee Chairs Eshoo and DeGette, sent letters to 12 companies that sell or broker short-term limited duration health insurance (STLDI) policies as part of an investigation into whether these policies discriminate against individuals with preexisting health conditions, putting consumers at significant financial risk.

Mar. 20, 2019 – Chairman Pallone and Subcommittee Chairwoman Jan Schakowsky sent a letter to Joseph J. Simons, Chairman of the Federal Trade Commission (FTC), on concerns over consumer privacy and the breaches that have occurred, especially as it relates to the U.S.'s largest technology companies. The letter further requests the FTC chairman to respond to a series of questions, including what resources the commission needs to improve its ability to protect Americans from deceptive and unwanted access and use of their private information.

Mar. 20, 2019 – Chairman Pallone joined with Senator Sheldon Whitehouse (D-RI) and Senator Thomas R. Carper (D-DE) in sending a letter to Charles J. Sheehan, Acting Inspector General of the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) regarding questions about whether two EPA officials helped to reverse the agency's position in a major enforcement action to favor a client of their former law firm, DTE Energy Company. The letter notes additional evidence that possibly implicates the two officials of the EPA Office of Air and Radiation may have violated federal ethics rules by participating in the development of the DTE Energy memo.

Mar. 21, 2019 – Chairman Pallone and Subcommittee Chairman Paul Tonko sent a letter to Andrew Wheeler, the Administrator of the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), requesting that EPA immediately release the health and safety studies it used to conduct its risk evaluation of Pigment Violet 29 (PV29), a chemical commonly found in paint and plastics.

Mar. 29, 2019 – Chairman Pallone joined House and Senate leaders – Rep. Elijah Cummings, Chair of the House Oversight and Reform Committee, Senator Ron Wyden, Ranking Member of Senate Committee on Finance, and Senator Patty Murray, Ranking Member of the Senate Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions – in sending two letters: (1) Daniel R. Levinson, Inspector General of the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), requesting he undertake a review of the Administrator of the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) adherence to the federal regulations and ethics requirements regarding the awarding of CMS contracts, in particular her hiring of Republican communications consults for her own benefit; and (2) Seema Verma, Administrator of the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services on the same subject.

Mar. 29, 2019 – Chairman Pallone and Jan Schakowsky, Chairwoman of the Subcommittee on Consumer Protection and Commerce, wrote a letter to the Acting Chairman of the Consumer Product Safety Commission, Ann Marie Buerkle, on reports that she coordinated with industry to delay or impede Consumer Product Safety Commission action on unsafe portable generators. Also included in the letter was a request for written responses to questions regarding this matter.
