No full Committee hearings were held in October of 2019.

**Markups**

The Committee on Energy and Commerce met, pursuant to notice, at 10:07 a.m., in the John D. Dingell Room, 2123 of the Rayburn House Office Building, Hon. Frank Pallone, Jr. (Chairman of the committee) presiding. The business before the committee was consideration and markup of 5 Medicare bills pending before the full Committee. The following actions were taken:

- (1) **H.R. 3**, the “the “Lower Drug Costs Now Act of 2019” (*Reps. Pallone, Neal, and Scott*) was ordered favorably reported to the House, amended, by a roll call vote: 30 – 22 (roll call no. 37) – **final passage**.  
The Committee considered 23 amendments offered during markup of H.R. 3.
- (2) **H.R. 4665**, the “Medicare Vision Act of 2019” (*Rep. Schrier*);” was ordered favorably reported to the House, without amendment, by a voice vote – **final passage**.
- (3) **H.R. 4671**, the “Help Seniors Afford Health Care Act” (*Rep. Kim*), was ordered favorably reported to the House, without amendment, by a voice vote – **final passage**.
- (4) **H.R. 4618** the “Medicare Hearing Act of 2019” (*Reps. McBath and Dingell*), was ordered favorably reported to the House, without amendment, by a voice vote – **final passage**.
- (5) **H.R. 4650**, the “Medicare Dental Act of 2019” (*Rep. Kelly of IL*), was ordered favorably reported to the House, amended, by a voice vote – **final passage**.

Whereupon, there being no further business to come before the Committee, the Committee adjourned at 10:03 p.m., subject to the call of the Chair.

LETTERS

Chairman Frank Pallone, Jr. with Subcommittee Chairs and other House and Senate Leaders

**September 6, 2019** – Chairman Pallone sent a letter to the Hon. Bobby Scott, Chairman of the Committee on Education and Labor, regarding H.R. 1309, the, “Workplace Violence Prevention for Health Care and Social Service Workers Act”. The letter was regarding the Committee on Energy and Commerce agreement to waive formal consideration of H.R. 1309 in order to expediate the consideration of the bill on the House floor. The Committee requested that appropriate consultation and involved as this bill or similar legislation moves forward, so that they may address any remaining issues within their jurisdiction. The letter also further requests to name the members of the Committee to any conference committee to consider such provisions, as well as a request to include this letter in the House report of the bill and in the *Congressional Record* during floor consideration of H.R. 1309.

**October 3, 2019** – Chairman Pallone sent a letter to the Comptroller General of the Government Accountability Office, Eugene L. Dodaro, regarding the months-long communications failures in Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands. In the letter, the Chairman expresses his concern with the additional deaths and burdens the communications network failures have caused in Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands. The letter requests that the communications failures be investigated and asks the Comptroller General to answer five questions that will contribute to the Committee’s understanding of the events.

**October 15, 2019**- Chairman Pallone sent a letter to House Committee on Oversight and Reform Chairman Elijah E. Cummings regarding waiving the jurisdiction of H.R. 3889, the “ONDCP Technical Corrections Act of 2019”. In the letter, the Chairman expresses his understanding that the jurisdiction over the subject matter is not waived and that the Committee shall be in consultation and involved in the legislation moving forward. The letter asks the Chairman Cummings to include the letter in the *Congressional Record* during House floor consideration.

**October 16, 2019** – Chairman Pallone sent a letter to Alex Azar, Secretary of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), and Seema Verma, Administrator of the Center for Medicaid and Medicare Services regarding the lack of response to the letter sent on June 13, 2019. In the letter, the Chairman expresses his concern with the HHS’s refusal to provide requested documents and information. The letter asks the Secretary and Administrator to provide the OACT analyses and the documents requested on June 13<sup>th</sup> no later than October 30, 2019.

**October 22, 2019** – Chairman Pallone and Communications and Technology Chairman Mike Doyle sent a letter to Chairman Ajit V. Pai and Commissioners of the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) regarding concerns over the attempt to deregulate the broadcast market by eliminating protections that would

prohibit greater consolidation in the South Dakota market and acting against the Court's ruling. In the letter, the Committee leaders expressed their concerns regarding whether the Order violated the FCC's rules. The letter asks the FCC to respond to four questions that will help the Committee better understand the actions of the FCC in this situation.

**October 30, 2019** – Chairman Pallone sent a letter to the President of the United States, Donald J. Trump, regarding his announcement on September 11, 2019, of the plan for the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) to publish a compliance policy “in the coming weeks” that would ban flavored e-cigarettes, including mint and menthol. In the letter, the Chairman expresses his concern that the administration was reconsidering this policy. The letter urged the President and his administration to issue the compliance policy that was announced without further delay and ensure the policy applies to all harmful flavored e-cigarette products, including those with mint and menthol flavors.
