- (1) The Subcommittee on Health held a hearing on **Wednesday**, **December 4**, **2019**, entitled, "Building Consumer Confidence by Empowering FDA to Improve Cosmetic Safety." This was a legislative hearing on two bills: H.R. 5279, the "Cosmetic Safety Enhancement Act of 2019", introduced by Rep. Pallone (D-NJ); and H.R. 4296, the "Safe Cosmetic and Personal Care Products Act of 2019", introduced by Rep. Schakowsky (D-IL).
- (2) The Subcommittee on Health held a hearing on **Tuesday, December 10, 2019**, entitled, "Proposals to Achieve Universal Health Care Coverage." This was a legislative hearing on seven bills: **H.R. 1277**, the "State Public Option Act", introduced by Rep. Luján (D-NM); **H.R. 1346**, the "Medicare Buy-In and Health Care Stabilization Act of 2019", introduced by Rep. Higgins (D-NY); **H.R. 1384**, the "Medicare for All Act of 2019", introduced by Reps. Jayapal (D-WA) and Dingell (D-MI); **H.R. 2000**, the "Medicare-X Choice Act of 2019", introduced by Rep. Delgado (D-NY); **H.R. 2452**, the "Medicare for America Act of 2019", introduced by Rep. DeLauro (D-CT); **H.R. 2463**, the "Choose Medicare Act", introduced by Rep. Richmond (D-LA); and **H.R. 4527**, the "Expanding Health Care Options for Early Retirees Act", introduced by Rep. Malinowski (D-NJ).

- (1) The Subcommittee on Oversight and Investigations held a hearing on **Wednesday**, **December 4**, **2019**, entitled, "Flu Season: U.S. Public Health Preparedness and Response." Witnesses included: Dr. Anthony S. Fauci, Director, National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Disease, National Institutes of Health; and Dr. Nancy Messonnier, Director, National Center for Immunization and Respiratory Disease, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.
- (2) The Subcommittee on Oversight and Investigations held a hearing on **Tuesday**, **December 10**, **2019**, entitled, "Securing the U.S. Drug Supply Chain: Oversight of FDA's Foreign Inspection Program." The Subcommittee examined the Food and Drug Administration's ability to effectively oversee the quality of drug products manufactured in foreign countries.

2019 Month of December

LETTERS

Chairman Frank Pallone, Jr. with Subcommittee Chairs and other House and Senate Leaders

December 6, 2019 – Chairman Pallone sent a letter to House Committee on Rules Chairman James P. McGovern regarding a House Amendment to H.R. 3, the Elijah E. Cummings Lower Drug Costs Now Act of 2019, consisting of the text of Rules Committee Print 116-41. In the letter, the Chairman describes how H.R. 3 will include important provisions to lower the costs of prescription drugs and expand access to health coverage. The letter requests that the Rules Committee hold a hearing on this measure and grant a closed rule for the consideration of the bill.

December 10, 2019 – Chairman Pallone, Ranking Member Walden, and Ways and Means Chairman Neal and Ranking Member Brady sent a letter to Administrator Seema Verma of the Centers for Medicaid & Medicare Services (CMS) regarding the updated Medicare Plan Finder. In the letter, the Committee leaders express their concerns that this recently launched finder is confusing, generating incorrect results, and leading beneficiaries to select plans that may not best fit their needs. The letter asks the CMS to provide a briefing for staff responding to seven specific questions about the new Plan Finder, future improvements, and how CMS will help the beneficiaries who used the Finder to make Medicare plan decisions by December 31, 2019.

December 12, 2019 – Chairman Pallone, Science, Space, and Technology Chairwoman Johnson, and Oversight and Reform Chairwoman Maloney sent a letter to Environmental Protection Agency Administrator Andrew Wheeler concerning efforts by EPA leadership to obstruct the work of the Inspector General. In the letter, the Committee leaders detail Administrator Wheeler's contradicting statements and memorandums that both support and undermine OIG authority. The letter asks the Administrator to instruct all EPA staff to cooperate with the OIG and provide a briefing for Committee staff by December 20, 2019, on the steps being taken by the EPA to address issues raised in the Seven Day Letter and December 10 OIG report.

December 13, 2019 – Chairman Pallone, Ways and Means Chairman Neal, Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions Ranking Member Senator Patty Murray, and Finance Ranking Member Wyden sent a letter to Health and Human Services (HHS) Secretary Alex Azar and Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) Administrator Seema Verma regarding Idaho's state-based marketplace, Your Health Idaho. In the letter, they express their concerns that this website will promote subpar, short-term insurance plans that don't meet consumer protections mandated under the Affordable Care Act. The letter asks HHS and CMS to answer five questions that will contribute to the Committee's understandings of their enforcement of patient protections by January 10, 2020.

December 16, 2019 — Chairman Pallone and Judiciary Chairman Nadler sent a letter to FCC Chairman Ajit V. Pai regarding the lack of transparency and appropriate process leading up to the FCC's approval of T-Mobile U.S., Inc.'s purchase of Sprint Corporation. In the letter, the Committee leaders express their concerns over the lack of documentation surrounding communication between the agency and company, the alteration of the merger task force's analysis to downplay the merger's competitive harm, and the insufficient notice and opportunity for public review and comment. The letter includes a request from the FCC to respond to three questions that will contribute to the Committee's understanding of these events.

December 17, 2019 – Chairman Pallone, Oversight and Reform Chairwoman Maloney, Senate Finance Ranking Member Wyden, and Senate Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions Ranking Member Murray sent a letter to Secretary Alex Azar of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) regarding the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid's (CMS) failure to fully respond to an earlier request for information and documents. In the letter, the Committee leaders reiterate their concerns over allegations that CMS Administrator Verma awarded millions of dollars in contracts to private consultants. The letter asks HHS to fully comply with their requests by no later than January 9, 2020, and to prioritize CMS's Office of the Administrator communications.

December 19, 2019 – Chairman Pallone, Ranking Member Walden, and Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions Chairman Alexander and Ranking Member Murray sent letters regarding the Committee's investigation into practices surrounding surprise billing to companies known for utilizing such practices: the CEO of UnitedHealth Group, David Wichmann; Interim CEO and Board Member of Health Care Service Corporation, David Lesar; President and CEO of Cigna, David Cordani; President and CEO of Highmark, David Holmberg; President and CEO of Anthem, Gail Boudreaux; President and CEO of TeamHealth, Leif Murphy; and President and CEO of Envision Healthcare, Christopher Holden. In the letter, the Committee leaders express their concerns surrounding the prevalence of surprise billing and its impacts on Americans. The letter requests the company to answer ten questions by no later than January 9, 2020, to help the Committee better understand the prevalence of, events surrounding, and laws regarding surprise billing.

December 19, 2019 – Chairman Pallone, Ranking Member Walden, and Subcommittee on Communications and Technology Chairman Doyle and Ranking Member Latta sent a letter to FCC Chairman Ajit V. Pai regarding the announcement that the Mobility Fund Phase II (MF II) will be replaced with a new 5G Fund. In the letter, the Committee leaders express their concerns that the new 5G Fund will not focus on expanding mobile services and coverage in rural America, deepening the digital divide. The letter asks the FCC to answer four questions to help the Committee better understand the steps the FCC will take to ensure reliable, safe coverage in areas that need support.

December 19, 2019 – Chairman Pallone, Education and Labor Committee Chairman Scott, Ways and Means Committee Chairman Neal, and Oversight and Reform Committee Chairwoman Maloney sent a letter to Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) Secretary Alex Azar regarding the proposed rule that changes nondiscrimination standards for HHS grant services. In the letter, the Committee leaders express their concerns that this rule will weaken civil rights

protections for Americans served by a wide array of Federally funded health and social services programs administered by HHS. The letter asks the HHS Secretary to withdraw these proposed rule provisions.
