

Full Committee

June 2011

The full Committee on Energy and Commerce held a markup on Wednesday, June 1 and 2, 2011, on the following legislation: H.R. 2021, the Jobs and Energy Permitting Act of 2011. The Full Committee ordered H.R. 2021 reported to the House, without amendment, by a vote of 34 yeas and 14 nays. The following amendments were considered: (1) Ms. Eshoo offered an amendment which was not agreed to by a vote of 15 yeas and 31 nays. (2) Mr. Waxman offered an amendment which was not agreed to by a vote of 13 yeas and 33 yeas. (3) Ms. Capps offered an amendment which was not agreed to by a vote of 13 yeas and 34 nays. (4) Ms. Matsui offered an amendment which was not agreed to by a vote of 16 yeas and 31 nays. (5) Mr. Markey offered an amendment which was not agreed to be a vote of 13 yeas and 34 nays.

The full Committee on Energy and Commerce held a markup on Thursday, June 23, 2011, on the following: (1) Semi-Annual Committee Activity Report; (2) H.R. 1938, the North American-Made Energy Security Act; and, (3) H.R. ____, the "Coal Residuals Reuse and Management Act."

- Semi-Annual Committee Activity Report: The Full Committee ordered the Semi-Annual Committee Activity Report reported to the House, with amendment, by a voice vote. The following amendments were considered: (1) Mr. Pallone offered an amendment which was agreed to, as amended, by a voice vote; Mr. Burgess offered an amendment to Mr. Pallone's amendment, which was agreed to by a voice vote, and Mr. Pallone offered an amendment to his own amendment, which was not agreed to by a vote of 15 yeas and 24 nays. (2) Mr. Engel offered an amendment which was agreed to by a vote of 28 yeas and 0 nays; Mr. Bass offered an amendment to Mr. Engel's amendment which was agreed to by a voice vote and Mr. Waxman also offered an amendment to Mr. Engel's amendment which was not agreed to by a vote of 14 yeas and 26 nays. (3) Mr. Waxman offered an amendment which was not agreed to by a vote of 15 yeas and 25 nays.
- H.R. 1938, the North American-Made Energy Security Act: The Full Committee ordered H.R. 1938 reported to the House, as amended, by a vote of 33 yeas and 13 nays. The following amendments were considered: (1) Mr. Waxman offered an amendment which was not agreed to by a voice vote. (2) Mr. Markey offered an amendment which was not agreed to by a vote of 17 yeas and 27 nays. (3) Mr. Dingell offered an amendment which was agreed to by a voice vote. (4) Mr. Rush offered an amendment which was not agreed to by a voice vote. (5) Ms. Christiansen offered an amendment which was not agreed to by a voice vote. (6) Ms. Eshoo offered an amendment which was withdrawn.

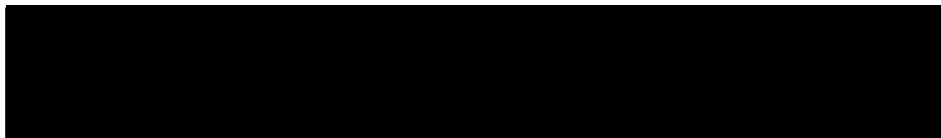

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

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
