**FOR THE MONTH OF JULY 2017**

**The Full Committee** conducted the following hearings and/or meetings during the month of July 2017:

**Wednesday, July 19, 2017**—The Full Committee held a Legislative Hearing on H.R. 424, To direct the Secretary of the Interior to reissue final rules relating to listing of the gray wolf in the Western Great Lakes and Wyoming under the Endangered Species Act of 1973, and for other purposes.

**Wednesday, July 19, 2017**—The Full Committee held a Legislative Hearing on H.R. 717, To amend the Endangered Species Act of 1973 to require review of the economic cost of adding a species to the list of endangered species or threatened species, and for other purposes.

**Wednesday, July 19, 2017**—The Full Committee held a Legislative Hearing on H.R. 1274, To amend the Endangered Species Act of 1973 to require making available to States affected by determinations that species are endangered species or threatened species all data that is the basis of such determinations, and for other purposes.

**Wednesday, July 19, 2017**—The Full Committee held a Legislative Hearing on H.R. 2603, To amend the Endangered Species Act of 1973 to provide that nonnative species in the United States shall not be treated as endangered species or threatened species for purposes of that Act.

**Wednesday, July 19, 2017**—The Full Committee held a Legislative Hearing on H.R. 3131, To amend the Endangered Species Act of 1973 to conform citizen suits under that Act with other existing law, and for other purposes. “Examining the Department of the Interior’s Spending Priorities and the President’s Fiscal Year 2018 Budget Proposal.”
