- Thursday, June 22, 2017**—The Full Committee convened a Markup for opening statements only.
- Tuesday, June 27, 2017**—The Full Committee held a Markup on H.R. 218, To provide for the exchange of Federal land and non-Federal land in the State of Alaska for the construction of a road between King Cove and Cold Bay.
- Tuesday, June 27, 2017**—The Full Committee held a Markup on H.R. 289, To authorize the Secretary of the Interior and the Secretary of Agriculture to issue permits for recreation services on lands managed by Federal agencies, and for other purposes.
- Tuesday, June 27, 2017**—The Full Committee held a Markup on H.R. 597, To take lands in Sonoma County, California, into trust as part of the reservation of the Lytton Rancheria of California, and for other purposes.
