

**April 2011**

The full Committee on Energy and Commerce held a markup on Tuesday, April 5, 2011, of the following legislation:

- H.R. 1343, a bill to Clarify NTIA and RUS Authority to Return Reclaimed Stimulus Funds to the U.S. Treasury. The Full Committee ordered H.R. 1343 reported to the House, as amended, by a voice vote. Mr. Walden offered an amendment which was agreed to by a voice vote.
- H.R. 1217, a bill to repeal the Prevention and Public Health Fund, as reported by the Subcommittee on Health. The Full Committee ordered H.R. 1217 reported to the House, without amendment, by a record vote of 26 yeas and 16 nays. Mrs. Matsui offered an amendment which was not agreed to by a voice vote.
- H.R. 1216, a bill to amend the Public Health Service Act to convert funding for graduate medical education in qualified teaching health centers from direct appropriations to an authorization of appropriations, as reported by the Subcommittee on Health. The Full Committee ordered H.R. 1216 reported to the House, without amendment, by a record vote of 21 yeas and 14 nays. Mr. Green offered an amendment which was not agreed to by a record vote of 14 yeas and 25 nays. Mrs. Matsui offered an amendment which was not agreed to by a voice vote.
- H.R. 1215, a bill to amend title V of the Social Security Act to convert funding for personal responsibility education programs from direct appropriations to an authorization of appropriations, as reported by the Subcommittee on Health. The Full Committee ordered H.R. 1215 reported to the House, without amendment, by a record vote of 25 yeas and 17 nays. Ms. Baldwin offered an amendment which was not agreed to by a record vote of 17 yeas and 20 nays. Ms. DeGette offered an amendment which was not agreed to by a record vote of 16 yeas and 23 nays.
- H.R. 1214, a bill to repeal mandatory funding for school-based health center construction, as reported by the Subcommittee on Health. The Full Committee ordered H.R. 1214 reported to the House, without amendment, by a record vote of 27 yeas and 15 nays. Mr. Dingell offered an amendment which was not agreed to by a voice vote. Ms. Capps offered an amendment which was not agreed to by a record vote of 16 yeas and 28 nays. Mr. Towns offered an amendment which was not agreed to by a record vote of 15 yeas and 27 nays. Mr. Rush offered an amendment which was not agreed to by a record vote of 16 yeas and 27 nays.

- H.R. 1213, a bill to repeal mandatory funding provided to States in the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act to establish American Health Benefit Exchanges, as reported by the Subcommittee on Health. The Full Committee ordered H.R. 1213 reported to the House, without amendment, by a record vote of 31 yeas and 20 nays. Mr. Pallone offered an amendment which was not agreed to by a record vote of 18 yeas and 31 nays. Mr. Markey offered an amendment which was not agreed to by a record vote of 17 yeas and 31 nays. Ms. Baldwin offered an amendment which was not agreed to by a record vote of 18 yeas and 30 nays. Ms. Capps offered an amendment which was not agreed to by a record vote of 18 yeas and 31 nays. Mrs. Matsui offered an amendment which was not agreed to by a voice vote.




