Dingell Room, 2123 of the Rayburn House Office Building, Hon. Mike Doyle, *the chairman*, presiding. The markup session convened at 10:07 a.m. to consider 11 bills pending before the subcommittee. **Chairman Frank Pallone, Jr. with Subcommittee Chairs and other House and Senate Leaders**

**March 5, 2020** – Chairman Frank Pallone, Jr., with House Committee on Ways and Means Chairman Richard E. Neal (D-MA), House Committee on Education and Labor Chairman Bobby Scott (D-VA), Senate Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions Ranking Member Patty Murray (D-WA), and Senate Committee on Finance Ranking Member Ron Wyden (D-OR), sent a joint letter to the Seema Verma, Administrator of the U.S. Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services, expressing concerns regarding policies included in the proposed rule, published on February 6, 2020, “Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (ACA); HHS Notice of Benefit and Payment Parameter for 2021.” The letter expresses their concern that, if implemented, the policies in the proposed rule would result in higher out-of-pocket costs for millions of Americans and cause thousands of low-income families to lose healthcare coverage. The congressional leaders called upon the Administration to cease its efforts to undermine the ACA and end policies that would increase premiums, force individuals off their healthcare coverage, and increase healthcare costs.

**March 5, 2020** – Committee on Energy and Commerce Chairman Pallone, with Ranking Member Greg Walden (R-OR), Subcommittee on Health Chairwoman Anna Eshoo, Subcommittee on Health Ranking Member Michael Burgess (R-TX), Subcommittee on Oversight Chair Diana DeGette (D-CO), and Subcommittee on Oversight Ranking Member Brett Guthrie (R-KY), sent a bipartisan letter to Stephen M. Hahn, M.D., Commissioner, Food and Drug Administration (FDA), to learn more about the FDA’s implementation of the FDA Reauthorization Act of 2017 (FDARA) with specific provisions related to marketing status reporting requirements. The role of marketing transparency is important to help promote generic competition and FDARA reauthorized four critical user fee programs to improve the review process for drugs, biosimilars, and medical devices. Since the law was enacted, the Committee has learned about ways in which manufactures may be manipulating the market to harm competition and raise prices. The Committee leaders requested that the FDA provide them with a briefing to discuss the types of temporary market withdraws that are being reported to the Agency under section 506I of FDARA and how the FDA is monitoring and tracking such marketing status information. They also asked that the briefing include information on actions that the FDA is taking in reporting any gaps or overlaps in regard to reporting requirements for manufactures that withdraw a product from the market.

**March 10, 2020** - Chairman Pallone, with Ranking Member Walden, Subcommittee on Health Chairwoman Eshoo, Subcommittee on Health Ranking Member Burgess, Subcommittee on Oversight Chair DeGette, and Subcommittee on Oversight Ranking Member Guthrie, sent a bipartisan letter to Food and Drug Administration Commissioner Stephen M. Hahn, M.D., to find out the impact the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak has had on the supply of safe drugs and medical products. The FDA plays a central role in ensuring the safety and effectiveness of medical products. Over the past few decades, drug manufacturing, particularly the manufacturing of active pharmaceutical ingredients, has relocated to foreign countries, and more recently other medical products, including personal protective equipment (PPE), have followed suit. To better understand what efforts the FDA is taking to mitigate supply chain problems, the Committee leaders asked that the FDA provide a briefing for Committee staff on how many manufacturers, distributors, and importers might be affected by supply chain issues as a result of the COVID-19 outbreak. They also asked that these staff members also be briefed on the FDA’s ongoing work to combat shortages of critical items, including what the Agency plans to do to address these shortages and how it intends to address conflicting priorities regarding the notifications of shortages related to response efforts against COVID-19.

**March 13, 2020** – Chairman Pallone, with Subcommittee on Consumer Protection and Commerce Chair Jan Schakowsky (D-IL) and Subcommittee on Oversight and Investigations Chair DeGette, sent a letter to the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) Chairman Joseph J. Simons urging him to take immediate action to prevent deceptive advertising and dangerous misinformation related to the COVID-19 outbreak. The letter asks the FTC to use its power to take immediate action and go after companies seeking to defraud consumers and hold industry responsible when they fail to enforce their own existing policies. The Committee leaders also requested a staff briefing on what the FTC is doing to counter misinformation and protect U.S. consumers, especially older Americans and immunocompromised individuals who are increasingly fearful over how to protect themselves from COVID-19.

**March 17, 2020** – House Committee on Energy and Commerce Chairman Pallone, with Subcommittee on Consumer Protection and Commerce Chair Schakowsky, House Committee on the Judiciary Chairman Jerrold Nadler (D-NY), and Judiciary Subcommittee on Antitrust Commercial and Administrative Law Chairman David N. Cicilline (D-RI), sent a letter to the Federal Trade Commission Chairman Joseph J. Simons regarding concerns about price gauging occurring in the face of a global pandemic, diminishing supplies and personal protective equipment (PPE) for healthcare professionals, as well as the lack of available household items such as hand sanitizer and cleaning supplies in retail stores and online marketplaces. The congressional leaders further asked the Federal Trade Commission to take immediate action against price gauging and the profiteers who are hoarding essential supplies or charging unconscionable prices for hoarded items. They urged the FTC to take such actions as the Congress works on legislation that will help in the Federal Trade Commission's efforts to halt the further victimization of Americans who are living in fear of their own and their loved ones health and safety.
