

**Subject: Formal Complaint Regarding Mass Communication Violation - Representative Brandon Gill (TX-26)**

To the House Communications Standards Commission:

I am a resident of Flower Mound, Texas, and a constituent of the 26th Congressional District. I am writing to submit a formal complaint against Representative Brandon Gill regarding a mass electronic communication distributed to constituents on May 4, 2026.

As detailed in the attached filing, this communication utilized official, taxpayer-funded House resources to disseminate graphic and medically inaccurate information regarding standard obstetric and gynecologic procedures. By labeling evidence-based medical care-including procedures that are essential for miscarriage management and life-saving postpartum care-as "barbaric" and "evil," the communication fails to meet the standards for factual accuracy, decorum, and civility required of official House communications.

Furthermore, I allege that this communication fails the "Official Business" requirement under 2 U.S.C. § 501, as it provides no legitimate informational or representational value to the district and instead provides medically misleading content that contradicts the clinical standards of the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists (ACOG).

Enclosed for your review:

- Formal Numbered Complaint: A structured grievance citing specific violations of the House Communications Standards Manual and Federal law.
- Exhibit A: A copy of the May 4, 2026, newsletter.

I request that the Commission investigate this matter, determine if an Advisory Opinion was properly obtained, and take appropriate remedial action to ensure the integrity of official House communications.

## Formal Complaint: House Communications Standards Commission

Subject: Formal Complaint Against Representative Brandon Gill Regarding Mass Communication Violation

1. **Identity of Complainant:** I, Jennifer Beavers, am a resident of Flower Mound, Texas, and a constituent of the 26th Congressional District. I am filing this formal grievance regarding the misuse of official House resources by the Office of Representative Brandon Gill.
2. **Incident Summary:** On May 4, 2026, the Office of Representative Brandon Gill distributed a mass electronic newsletter to a broad constituent base via official "@mail.house.gov" servers. This content was also disseminated via the Representative's official, verified social media channels.
3. **Medical Standing:** I am a mother of two who required a life-saving dilation and curettage (D&C) following a live birth due to a postpartum medical emergency (retained products of conception). This procedure is an evidence-based, standard medical intervention used to prevent maternal hemorrhage and sepsis.
4. **Allegation of Misinformation:** The May 4 newsletter provided descriptions of the D&C procedure and other obstetric interventions using non-clinical and graphic language, specifically labeling these standard medical procedures as "barbaric" and "evil." These characterizations are factually inconsistent with the clinical definitions and applications recognized by the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists (ACOG).
5. **Violation of Decorum and Civility:** I allege that this communication violates the House Communications Standards Manual section on "Decorum and Civility." The Manual prohibits the use of official communications to disparage individuals or use inflammatory, non-factual rhetoric. Characterizing a procedure used for miscarriage management and life-saving maternal care as "evil" constitutes a failure to maintain professional decorum.
6. **Failure of Official Business Requirement:** Under 2 U.S.C. § 501, official resources must be used for "Official Business" that provides informational value. Disseminating medical information that contradicts established clinical standards - and omitting the life-saving applications of these procedures - removes the "informational" value of the communication, rendering it a misuse of taxpayer-funded resources.
7. **Impact and Scope:** Medical statistics indicate that approximately 1 in 4 pregnancies end in loss. In a district of this size, it is a statistical certainty that thousands of constituents who have undergone these procedures for medically necessary reasons were recipients of this inflammatory content.

- Whether this communication received a required Advisory Opinion prior to distribution.
  - Whether the final distributed text matched the version submitted for review.
  - Whether the use of non-clinical, stigmatizing language regarding medical care meets the minimum standards of factual accuracy for a Member of Congress.

9. **Request for Remedy:** Should a violation be found, I request that the Representative be required to issue a factual correction to the district and reimburse the U.S. Treasury for the costs of this distribution, as provided for in the Commission's Rules of Practice.

I Asked an Abortion Advocate Her Favorite Method of Abortion

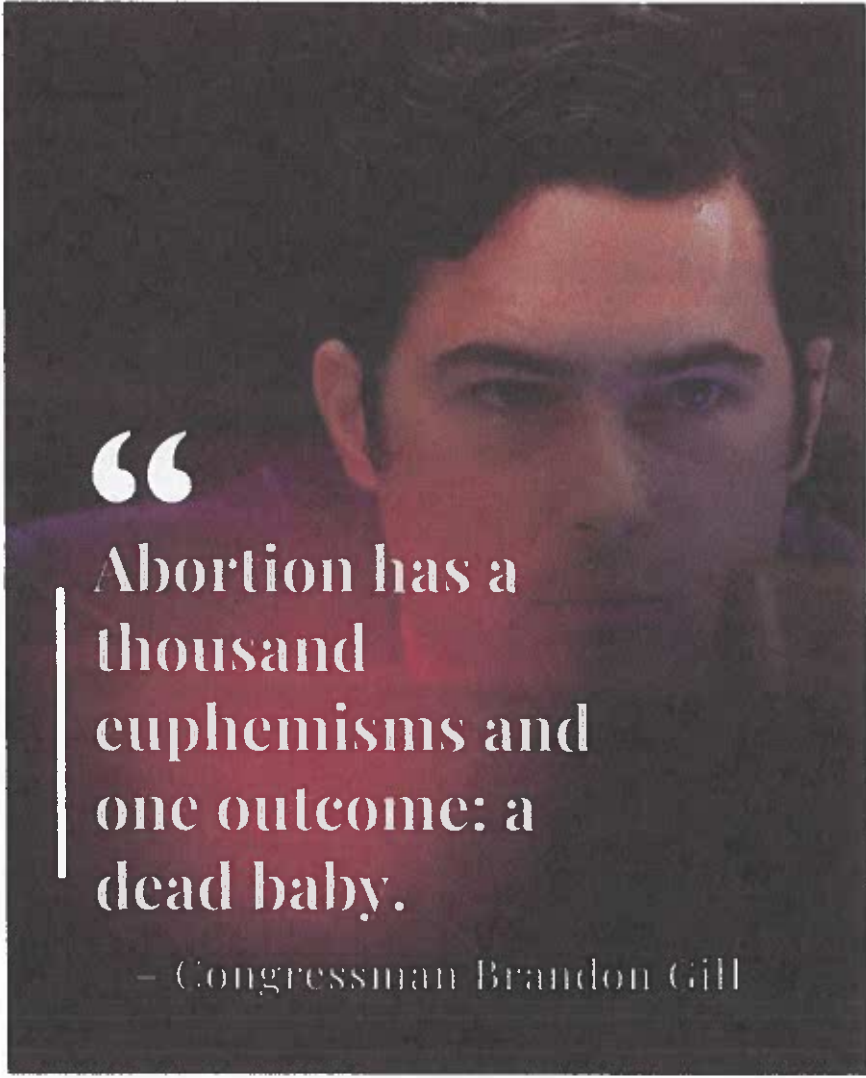

Last week, I asked an abortion advocate a simple question: What is your favorite method of abortion?

The barbaric reality of abortion wasn't something she wanted to hear.

She knows exactly what abortion is. She just didn't want to say it out loud — because the moment you describe it, the euphemisms collapse.

So I described it for her.

**Suction abortion:** the cervix is dilated, and a vacuum 29 times more powerful than a household appliance tears the baby's body apart and pulls the pieces through a tube.

**Dilation and curettage:** a sharp, looped knife is inserted into the uterus and the baby is cut into pieces.

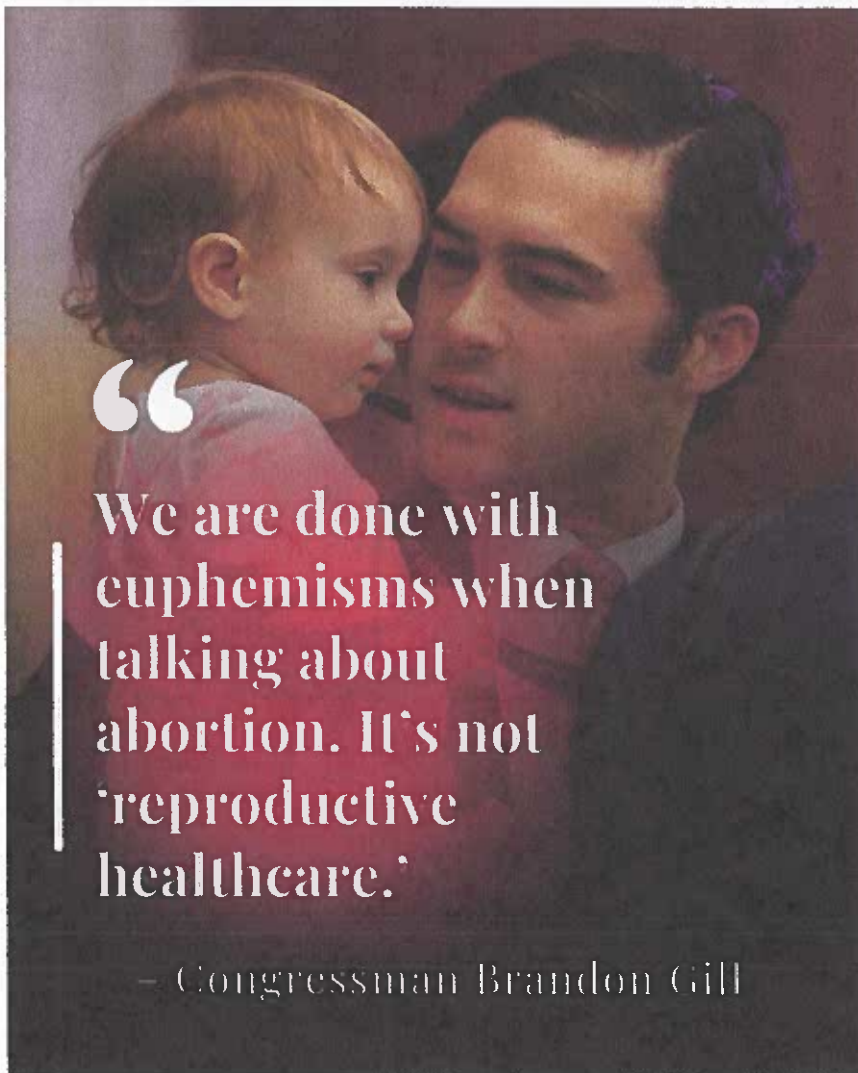
**Dilation and evacuation:** forceps grab and twist the baby's body to dismember it limb by limb. If the head is too large, it is crushed.

**Saline injection:** a salt solution is injected into the amniotic fluid. The baby's skin burns off. The baby ingests it. The baby dies of salt poisoning, dehydration, and brain hemorrhaging.

After each one, I asked: Do you prefer that method?

Each time, she said she'd rather talk about something else.

Because it's barbaric and evil.

## DHS Funding Update

**Supplemental Evidence Report: Clinical Accuracy and Statistical Impact (TX-26)**

Subject: Supplemental Medical and Statistical Evidence Regarding the May 4 Newsletter distributed by the Office of Representative Brandon Gill

**Section I: Clinical Definitions and Medical Necessity**

The May 4 newsletter utilized non-clinical, inflammatory rhetoric to describe standard medical procedures. According to the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists (ACOG) and the American Medical Association (AMA), the following procedures are essential, evidence-based components of reproductive and maternal healthcare:

Procedure	Clinical Application & Medical Necessity
Dilation and Curettage (D&C)	Used to remove retained products of conception (RPOC) following a miscarriage or a live birth. It is a life-saving intervention for postpartum hemorrhage and sepsis (infection).
Suction Aspiration	The primary clinical method for managing first-trimester spontaneous pregnancy loss (miscarriage) to ensure the complete removal of tissue and prevent life-threatening complications.
Dilation and Evacuation (D&E)	The standard of care for second-trimester pregnancy loss or when a patient faces severe health risks (e.g., pre-eclampsia or premature rupture of membranes).

**Medical Authority Reference:**

"Dilation and curettage (D&C) is a critical tool for diagnosing and treating uterine conditions... and is used to prevent infection or heavy bleeding by clearing tissues that remain in the uterus after a miscarriage or delivery." — *Mayo Clinic / ACOG Practice Bulletin No. 200 (Reaffirmed 2025)*.

## Section II: Statistical Impact Analysis (Texas 26th District)

Based on the 2024–2026 Census Data for Texas's 26th Congressional District (Total Population: ~885,000) and established maternal health statistics, the reach of the May 4 newsletter is quantified below:

- **Impacted Women (TX-26):** With approximately 338,000 adult women in the district, and a clinical pregnancy loss rate of 1 in 4 (25%), an estimated **84,500 women** in the district have experienced the procedures described in the newsletter as "barbaric."
- **Impacted Partners (TX-26):** Including spouses and partners who share the trauma of pregnancy loss, as many as **169,000 adults** in the 26th District have a direct personal history with these medical interventions.
- **Preventability:** The 2026 America's Health Rankings and the 2024 Texas MMMRC Joint Biennial Report confirm that 80% of pregnancy-related deaths in Texas are preventable, often through the timely application of the very procedures disparaged in the newsletter.

## Section III: Professional and Peer-Reviewed References

1. **ACOG Practice Bulletin No. 200: "Early Pregnancy Loss" (2025 Reaffirmation).** Establishes D&C and aspiration as the gold standard for miscarriage management.
2. **Texas Maternal Mortality and Morbidity Review Committee (MMMRC): Joint Biennial Report (2024) and 2026 Clinical Updates.** Cites obstetric hemorrhage and sepsis as leading causes of preventable death, treated by uterine evacuation (D&C).
3. **JAMA Network Open (2024/2025): "Patient-Physician Trust and the Impact of Medical Misinformation in Public Policy."** Highlights how non-clinical rhetoric from official sources degrades patient trust in life-saving interventions.
4. **Health Affairs (2024): "Preventing Pregnancy-Related Mental Health Deaths."** Documents the psychological impact of stigmatizing reproductive healthcare on postpartum populations.

## Section IV: Statement of Factual Misrepresentation

The newsletter disseminated on May 4, 2026, failed to provide clinical context for the procedures listed. By omitting their application in emergency maternal care - such as the life-saving D&C I received for retained products of conception - the office distributed medically incomplete information through official House channels, a violation of the House Communications Standards Manual requirement for factual and professional decorum.

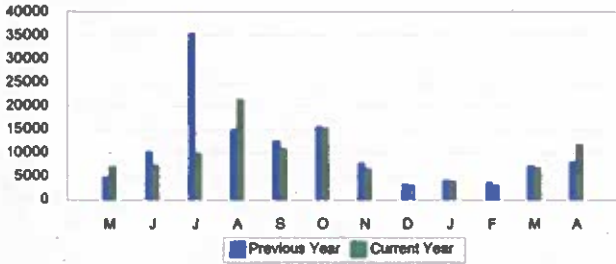
