H.R. 2213                      Homeland Security                      Anti-Border Corruption Reauthorization Act of 2017

The Committee granted, by voice vote, a structured rule for H.R. 2213. The rule provides one hour of debate equally divided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of the Committee on Homeland Security. The rule waives all points of order against consideration of the bill. The rule provides that an amendment in the nature of a substitute recommended by the Committee on Homeland Security now printed in the bill shall be considered as adopted, and the bill, as amended, shall be considered as read.
