The Committee on Energy and Commerce met, pursuant to notice, at 11 a.m., a quorum being present, for a virtual markup on the Committee’s WebEx platform, Hon. Frank Pallone, Jr. (Chairman of the committee) presiding. The business before the Committee was to consider legislative recommendations to comply with the reconciliation directive included in section 2001 of the Concurrent Resolution on the Budget for Fiscal Year 2021, S. Con. Res. 5. The following actions were taken:

**Chairman Frank Pallone, Jr., Subcommittee Chairs and other House and Senate Leaders**

**February 2, 2021** – Chairman Pallone, along with Subcommittee on Communications and Technology Chairman Mike Doyle, Subcommittee on Consumer Protection and Commerce Chair Jan Schakowsky, Subcommittee on Health Chairwoman Anna Eshoo, and Subcommittee on Oversight and Investigations Chair Diana DeGette sent letters to the following technology companies seeking information about false and misleading information on their platforms: Sundar Pichai, Chairman and CEO of Google; Jack Dorsey, CEO of Twitter; Mark Zuckerberg, Chairman and CEO of Facebook. The Committee asked for responses to questions on steps each company has taken to limit COVID-19 vaccine misinformation.

**February 9, 2021** – Chairman Pallone, along with Subcommittee on Consumer Protection and Commerce Chair Jan Schakowsky wrote to Tim Cook, CEO of Apple urging review and improvement of Apple’s new App privacy labels amid recent reports the labels are misleading or inaccurate.

**February 10, 2021** – Chairman Pallone wrote to Hon. Jeffrey Zients, White House COVID-19 response coordinator requesting a briefing on details of national COVID-19 vaccine plan.

**February 19, 2021** – Chairman Pallone along with Subcommittee on Energy Chairman Bobby Rush, Subcommittee on Oversight and Investigations Chair Diana DeGette, Representative Marc Veasey and Representative Lizzie Fletcher wrote to Hon. Greg Abbott, Governor of Texas, wanting answers as to why Texans were left in the dark without power, heat, food, water, and medicine for several days during winter storm.

**February 23, 2021** – Chairman Pallone along with Subcommittee on Communications and Technology Chairman Mike Doyle, Subcommittee on Consumer Protection and Commerce Chair Jan Schakowsky, and Subcommittee on Oversight and Investigations Chair Diana DeGette wrote to Mark Zuckerberg, Chairman and CEO of Facebook regarding Facebook’s role in knowingly allowing extremist content and groups to grow on the platform and Facebook’s own policies were responsible for the spread of extremism and disinformation.

**February 24, 2021** – Chairman Pallone along with Subcommittee on Health Chairwoman Anna Eshoo and Subcommittee on Oversight and Investigations Chair DeGette sent a letter to Hon. Alex M. Azar II, Secretary of Health and Human Services, following up in the Committee’s investigation into Trump Administration’s family separation policy asking him to clarify his role in the policy.

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### **Information from the Committee for the Congress and the Public**

During the month of February, the Committee on Energy and Commerce staff, at the direction of the Chairman and its members, worked on developing and providing the best tools to enable its members to safely convene and work together on the important issues under the Committee's jurisdiction. Among the Committee's earliest work products as the pandemic arrived in the U.S. was creation of several fact sheets providing vital information on COVID-19, along with publishing website links to important pandemic resources.
