The Subcommittee on Energy met, pursuant to notice, at 10 a.m. in the John D. Dingell Room, 2123 of the Rayburn House Office Building, the Hon. Bobby L. Rush (Chairman of the subcommittee) presiding. The business before the subcommittee was consideration and markup of 9 energy bills referred to the subcommittee. The following actions were taken:

- (1) **H.R. 2906, the “Clean Commute for Kids Act of 2019”** (*Cardenas of CA*), was favorably forwarded to the full Committee, without amendment, by a voice vote;
- (2) **H.R. 3361, the “Reliable Investment in Vital Energy Reauthorization Act”** or the “**RIVER Act**” (*McKinley, Tonko, Loeb sack, Watkins, and Tipton*), was favorably forwarded to the full Committee, without amendment, by a voice vote;
- (3) **H.R. 3079, the “Energy Savings Through Public-Private Partnerships Act of 2019”** (*Welch of VT and Kinzinger of IL*), was favorably forwarded to the full Committee, without amendment, by a voice vote;
- (4) **H.R. 5518**, a bill to require the Secretary of Energy to establish a grant program for States to provide incentives to natural gas distribution systems (*McEachin of IL*), was favorably forwarded to the full Committee, without amendment, by a voice vote;
- (5) **H.R. 5542**, a bill to require the Secretary of Energy to establish a grant program for States to provide incentives to natural gas distribution systems (*Sherrill and Blunt Rochester*), was favorably forwarded to the full Committee, without amendment, by a voice vote;
- (6) **H.R. 5541, the “Tribal Power Act”** (*O’Halloran and Mullin*), was favorably forwarded to the full Committee, without amendment, by a voice vote;

LETTERS

Chairman Frank Pallone, Jr. with Subcommittee Chairs and other House and Senate Leaders

**January 7, 2020** – Chairman Pallone, Ranking Member Walden, with Chairwoman DeGette and Ranking Member Guthrie of the Subcommittee on Oversight and Investigations sent a letter to the Food and Drug (FDA) Commissioner Stephen Hahn, M.D. about the FDA’s compliance with Good Laboratory Practices (GLPs) and animal welfare regulations in their research activities. In the letter, the Committee leaders outline their concerns that the Committee does not have all the necessary documents and information regarding a third-party investigation into the FDA’s animal research programs. The letter asks the Commissioner to respond by January 21, 2020, to six questions that would allow the Committee to better understand animal welfare in the FDA.

**January 14, 2020** – Chairman Pallone, Ranking Member Walden, Chairwoman Eshoo and Ranking Member Burgess of the Subcommittee on Health, and Chair DeGette and Ranking Member Guthrie of the Subcommittee on Oversight and Investigations sent letters to Department of Homeland Security Acting Secretary Chad Wolf, Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) Secretary Alex Azar, and Drug Enforcement Administration Acting Administrator Uttam Dhillon about the increasing use of stimulants in the United States. In the letter, they detail their concerns over the rise in the use of cocaine and methamphetamine across the country, along with the health effects of this rise. They ask the Acting Secretary to provide a briefing by February 4, 2020, about this issue to Committee staff.

**January 14, 2020** – Chairman Pallone and Senate Committee on Finance Ranking Member Senator Ron Wyden sent a letter to Christi A. Grimm, the Principal Deputy Inspector General of the Office of Inspector General at HHS, about Tennessee’s section 1115 waiver proposal to block grant its Medicaid program. The Committee leaders express their concerns that this proposal would threaten access to care for vulnerable Tennesseans in the letter. They encourage the Office of Inspector General to oversee these waiver requests and request a briefing for Committee staff to understand HHS’s current work plan to oversee state 1115 waivers.

**January 15, 2020** – Chairman Pallone and Chairman Doyle of the Subcommittee on Communications and Technology sent a letter to Department of Homeland Security Acting Secretary Chad Wolf and Federal Communications Commission (FCC) Chairman Ajit Pai regarding their concerns over the security of American telecommunications networks after the killing of Iranian General Qasem Soleimani. In the letter, the Committee leaders describe the actions taken by both the U.S. and Iran that have led to these concerns. They request that the Department of Homeland Security and FCC provide a briefing for Committee staff by February 5, 2020, to clarify the actions it has taken to warn telecommunication providers of these threats, the defensive efforts these providers have taken, and the answers to five questions regarding these actions.

**January 17, 2020** – Chairman Pallone, Ranking Member Walden, Rep. Raul Ruiz, and Rep. Markwayne Mullin sent a letter to the Comptroller General of the United States Gene L. Dodaro of the Government Accountability Office (GAO) regarding their concerns that old or inadequate facilities and medical equipment negatively impact the quality of healthcare available to American Indian and Alaska

Natives through the Indian Health Service (IHS). The letter asks the GAO to investigate three matters that would provide insight into the effects of this aging equipment and the IHS's efforts to maintain this infrastructure and increase its capacity to provide quality healthcare.

**January 17, 2020** – Chairman Pallone, Ranking Member Walden, Chairwoman Eshoo and Ranking Member Burgess of the Subcommittee on Health, and Chair DeGette and Ranking Member Guthrie of the Subcommittee on Oversight and Investigations, sent a letter to FDA Commissioner Stephen Hahn, M.D., regarding the FDA's approval process for complex generic drug products. In the letter, the Committee leaders share their concerns that the FDA approval process may discourage the development of complex drugs due to the length of approval time. The letter requests that the FDA provide answers to five questions that would allow the Committee to better understand this approval process by January 31, 2020.

**January 21, 2020** – Chairman Pallone, Ranking Member Walden, Chairman Neal and Ranking Member Brady of the Committee on Ways and Means, and Chairman Scott and Ranking Member Foxx of the Committee on Education and Labor, sent a letter to HHS Secretary Alex Azar and Department of Labor (DOL) Secretary Eugene Scalia regarding challenges facing workers and retirees that can result in unexpected penalties and out-of-pocket expenses. In the letter, the Committee leaders expressed their concerns over the lack of transparency and clear information about the transition between coverage under a group health plan subject to the Consolidated Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1985 (COBRA) to Medicare coverage for eligible Americans. They request that HHS and DOL immediately collaborate on solutions to mitigate this financial risk and by January 31, 2020, answer three questions that would give the Committees a clearer picture of affected Americans and how HHS and DOL can address this issue.

**January 23, 2020** – Chairman Pallone, Chair DeGette of the Subcommittee on Oversight and Investigations, and Chairman Tonko of the Subcommittee on Environment and Climate Change sent a letter to Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Administrator Andrew Wheeler regarding the recently released information that shows a significant increase in the backlog of unfunded Superfund cleanups in Fiscal Year 2019. In the letter, the Committee members outline their concerns that these unfunded Superfund cleanups affect many Americans and mean that the EPA is failing to implement the program. The Committee leaders request a briefing by February 6, 2020, answering five questions about the basis for and impact of this increase and any Agency actions to address this issue.

**January 24, 2020** – Chairman Pallone and Ranking Member Walden sent a letter to Gene L. Dodaro, Comptroller General of the GAO, regarding an updated review of the National Telecommunications and Information Administration's (NTIA) Federal spectrum management process and its collaboration with the FCC. In the letter, the Committee leaders expressed their concerns that the Federal spectrum management process has broken down in the past and that the NTIA and FCC are not properly overseeing the Nation's Federal spectrum users. They request that the GAO study six questions regarding the NTIA, FCC, and Federal spectrum coordinators and provide recommendations to ensure efficient use of national airwaves.
