

The Full Committee conducted the following hearings and/or meetings during the month of October 2017:

**Tuesday, October 3, 2017**—The Full Committee convened a Markup for opening statements only.

**Wednesday, October 4, 2017**—The Full Committee held a Markup on H.R. 210, To facilitate the development of energy on Indian lands by reducing Federal regulations that impede tribal development of Indian lands, and for other purposes.

**Wednesday, October 4, 2017**—The Full Committee held a Markup on H.R. 424, To direct the Secretary of the Interior to reissue final rules relating to listing of the gray wolf in the Western Great Lakes and Wyoming under the Endangered Species Act of 1973, and for other purposes.

**Wednesday, October 4, 2017**—The Full Committee held a Markup on H.R. 717, To amend the Endangered Species Act of 1973 to require review of the economic cost of adding a species to the list of endangered species or threatened species, and for other purposes.

**Wednesday, October 4, 2017**—The Full Committee held a Markup on H.R. 1274, To amend the Endangered Species Act of 1973 to require making available to States affected by determinations that species are endangered species or threatened species all data that is the basis of such determinations, and for other purposes.
