
As Ranking Member of the Committee on House Administration, which has broad oversight of our nation's federal elections, I write today to express my concern about a recent report that no logic and accuracy testing was conducted for voting machines prior to day of the Nevada primary election on June 14, 2022, which has been required by Nevada law since at least 1975.<sup>1</sup>

America's decentralized elections system is the best in the world, and Republicans are committed to ensuring all eligible voters who want to participate are able to cast ballots and have those ballots counted according to law. Since last Congress, I have met with Secretaries of State, Lt. Governors, and local election administrators from states as wide-ranging as Alaska, Iowa, and New York, among others, to learn about and promote the many first-rate examples of excellence in election administration across the country. Unfortunately, rather than add to those efforts, situations like this one in Clark County have the potential to do real damage to voter confidence in our election systems and outcomes at a time when we can least afford it.

In the interest of ensuring that voter confidence in our elections processes and outcomes is protected in the next federal election, please respond with whether Clark County performed logic and accuracy testing before election day, as required by law, and, if so, when the testing occurred. If your office did not perform logic and accuracy testing before the election, as required by law, please provide a response that explains the rationale for such decision and how it complies with law. Further, please explain how you will ensure that your office completes voting machine logic and accuracy testing in future elections, including the upcoming federal election. In your response, please include any procedural or regulatory changes you will make or seek to ensure this oversight does not recur.
