The rule makes in order only those amendments to H.R. 1213 that are printed in the Rules Committee report accompanying the resolution. The rule provides that each such amendment may be offered only in the ordered printed in the report, may be offered only by a Member designated in the report, shall be considered as read, shall be debatable for the time specified in the report equally divided and controlled by the proponent and an opponent, shall not be subject to amendment, and shall not be subject to a demand for division of the question in the House or in the Committee of the Whole. 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
