Dear Attorney General Garland:

I serve as a member of the U.S. House of Representatives Committee on House Administration and its Subcommittee on Elections, which has broad oversight of our nation's federal election laws. I am aware of an ongoing investigation into whether foreign money was illegally contributed to Eric Adams' campaign for Mayor of New York City.² It appears that the principal allegation being investigated is whether the Adams campaign "colluded with the government of Turkey and illegally accepted donations from Turkish citizens as part of a straw donor scheme."3

As you know, it is unlawful for any foreign person to contribute to any federal, state, or local political campaign.4 These federal law prohibitions exist not only to protect our electoral systems from foreign influence but also to give Americans confidence that only American citizens are participating in American elections. On November 30, 2023, the House Committee on Administration held a legislative markup, where I had the privilege of voting to pass H.R. 3229, the Stop Foreign Funds in Elections Act. This legislation would prohibit contributions or donations by foreign nationals in connection with state or local ballot initiatives, referenda, or recall elections – a bill critical to protect our elections from foreign influence. Similar initiatives are paramount in safeguarding our nation's electoral system.

The allegations levied against the Adams campaign are quite serious and must be investigated thoroughly. As a retired NYPD detective tasked with upholding the law, I urge your office to prosecute this case and other similar activities to the fullest extent of the law, if prosecution of this case becomes warranted as the facts develop in your investigation. Americans need to see that those who act unlawfully to threaten the integrity of our election systems are penalized appropriately.
